






A message from Mark . . .

Solomons in store for OFC final . . .

The All Whites now know who they need to overcome to earn a place in the intercontinental play-off for the 2018 FIFA World Cup after Solomon Islands topped Group B in Stage 3 of the



Oceania qualifying process. The two-legged OFC final will be contested between August 28 and September 5 with the aggregate winner going on to meet the fifth-placed CONMEBOL team for a berth in Russia.

New Zealand had already secured their spot in the final by holding off the challenges of New Caledonia and Fiji to top Group A and have now been joined by the Solomon Islands, who emerged triumphant in a thrilling finale to the other pool. Going into the final match day, all three sides in Group B could still finish top with Tahiti sitting in first place but with no games remaining and in danger of being overtaken by either Solomon Islands or Papua New Guinea.

To keep their chances alive, Papua New Guinea needed a comfortable win over their Solomon rivals on home soil at PNG Football Stadium in Port Moresby and had a glimmer of hope when Raymond Gunemba, who starred for Hamilton Wanderers in the Stirling Sports Premiership last season, capitalised on a defensive error to give his side an early lead.

But the celebrations were short-lived as another player with Stirling Sports Premiership experience, former Canterbury United defender Felix Komolong, was dismissed in the 30th minute for handling in the box and Solomon skipper Henry Fa'arodo equalised from the resulting penalty. A stunning effort from Jerry Donga in the closing seconds of the first half proved to be the winner, his precision placement putting the ball out of goalkeeper Ronald Warisan's reach. It's the first time in 12 years the Solomon Islands have qualified for the OFC play-off final.

The draw for the home-and-away final will be held on Thursday 15 June at 4pm in Auckland and will be live streamed via OFC TV on the official OFC social media channels

Smeltz confident for opener . . .

All Whites striker Shane Smeltz says the team have no problem with the low expectations on them heading into the FIFA Confederations Cup.



The 35-year-old evergreen forward,

who is attending his third FIFA Confederations Cup in Russia, said the team are looking forward to surprising a few people when the tournament kicks off this Saturday (Sunday 3am NZT) in the opening game against the hosts in St Petersburg. New Zealand has never won at a FIFA Confederations Cup. Their best result remains a 0-0 draw with Iraq in 2009 and Smeltz said this team has set its sights on making history in the 'Tournament of Champions'.

"There are probably not too many people at this tournament who will expect us to do too much here," said Smeltz to a packed press conference today in St Petersburg. "I'm sure that everyone is expecting Russia to win that first game, but internally we have our own ambition and our own focus and we obviously hope to fulfil that."

Smeltz said the team has had a good build-up to this event. They have played two international friendlies against Northern Ireland (1-0 loss) and Belarus (1-0 loss) and staged a training camp in Dublin that was all about match fitness. "Now it is all about mentality. We have been preparing for this for a long time now so we go into this opening game in a good position."

One of the heroes from the FIFA World Cup campaign in 2010, where the All Whites famously did not lose a game in pool play, said the team is taking things one game at a time. The main focus is on the opening game as they look to upset the World No 63 Russia who recently drew 1-1 with Chile.

Smeltz confident for opener. . .

"If we can do what we want to do in that game then it sets us up well for the rest of the tournament," said Smeltz. "We definitely have the ambition to get through to the semifinals. We are here to win games. We



are not just here to make up the numbers. The full focus of our preparation has been on our first game."

The All Whites will then meet World No 17 Mexico in Sochi on 21 June and finish their pool play against European Champions and World No 8 Portugal in St Petersburg on 24 June.

Smeltz said the results in the last few friendlies have not been a major concern for the team or the coaching staff. The international friendlies were much more about performance and getting ready for the main event.

"We had only just come together when we went down to Northern Ireland and there was some very good things to come from that game. It could have easily been another result. There is plenty of belief in this squad."

He said the lack of goals in the past two international friendlies was not a worry as the team has proven they have goal scorers and are up for the challenge of trying to scoring against quality teams.

"You always want to be scoring goals, but I look around the squad and know that this team has plenty of goals in this squad," he said. "It is just a matter of us now having that belief and that target of going out there and putting it in the back of the net. We have Woodsy [Chris Wood] coming off an unbelievable season in the Championship in England, and we have many other players around him who can score goals. There is definitely a belief in this squad that we have goals in us."
