Our junior teams are also buzzing, with fantastic energy and enthusiasm on show across the grades. It's always a joy to see our youngest players out on the pitch — their love of the game is contagious and a great reminder of what football is all about.

Looking ahead, the countdown is well and truly on for our Centenary Celebration over Matariki Weekend — Thursday 19 to Sunday 22 June. We've got a full programme of events lined up across Maidstone Park and our old home at Harcourt Park. It's a once-in-ageneration moment for the club, and we can't wait to honour our 100-year history with as many of you as possible. 
